



Safety Notice

Your Safety is our primary concern at Gone Sailing Adventures. All of our yachts exceed Transport Canada minimum safety and manning requirements.

In Canada all commercial vessels carrying passengers may voluntarily enroll in Transport Canada's Small Vessel Compliance Program. Gone Sailing Adventures yachts are all enrolled in this program in order to demonstrate our commitment to our customers' safety and security while sailing with us. As such we are subject to inspection and audit at any time.

All Gone Sailing Yachts undergo a continuous inspection and maintenance program to ensure the vessel you are sailing on is safe and reflects the highest level of comfort available in the industry. Your crew also completes ongoing safety drills and training throughout the season.

Each yacht and its crew carry proof of its enrollment and individual certifications on board.

Safety is a shared responsibility – between the operator and the passenger. At the start of your excursion, you will receive a short safety briefing. Please listen carefully and know where lifejackets and other safety equipment are located and what you should do in the event of an emergency.

Wearing a life jacket while on our yachts is not a requirement. However, we have instituted a policy for children under 12 years of age that wearing a life jacket is mandatory. This enables the children to have more free access to the forward deck and their parents to enjoy their trip while knowing their children are safe around the water.
